Whether it is allergies, sickness, or simply the cold wind hitting you in the face when you walk out the door, seems that everything is trying to take your breath from you. With that in mind, have you ever truly thought how precious your breath is?

If He's mindful of our every breath, won't He be aware of our every need, our every worry, our every aspiration? Jesus tells us in Matthew 7:11, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!" After all, isn't He the one who gave us breath in the first place? In Genesis 2:7 we read, "Then the Lord God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature."

The Creator who breathed life into dust, who masterfully designed the detailed networks of our lungs, is the same God who promises to provide for us, guide us, and sustain us. As we breathe, may each breath we take in remind us of His lifegiving grace, and each exhale of our surrender to His will. Let the rhythm of our breath echo the rhythm of trust we have in Him. After all, the breath and life we have on earth is temporary, but the life we can have in Christ is eternal. So as we go through these colder months, even if our breath becomes more of a struggle, let us take a moment and thank our Heavenly Father for each breath He provides us and the wonderful blessings that we have when we choose to follow Him.
