THANKSGIVING

With Thanksgiving next week, all around people begin to ask themselves what they are truly thankful for. Commercials and TV shows depict families and friends coming together and reflecting on how thankful they are for each other. Take a moment and ask yourself, what are you truly thankful for? Maybe it is your family and friends, like many of the commercials show on TV. Maybe it is your success in your career or the fact that you have a home and a car. You might simply be thankful that you can pay your bills and have food at the end of the day. Regardless of what we are truly thankful for, I have a feeling that our lists and Paul's wouldn't read quite the same.

In 2 Corinthians 12:10, Paul says "Therefore I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in distresses, in persecutions, in difficulties, in behalf of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong." When you take this passage, and read it slowly, you begin to see a quite different thanksgiving list than what we usually think about today. For example, how could anyone take delight or be thankful about having weaknesses. We don't often find joy in our inabilities to produce results. As a matter of fact, in our society, we mostly judge the success of an individual based on their strengths and success. But, if this seems strange already, it only gets stranger.

How could anyone be thankful or find delight in insults? I don't know of anyone who just likes to be treated harshly or put down all the time. In our society today, there are many who cannot even function without words of encouragement from others. They spend all their time at school, work, or on social media seeking that positive affirmation from anyone. Paul goes on to say that he delights in distresses. You know, we are living in a time right now where the mere cost of even our necessities is becoming overwhelming. We hear about it on the news, and I don't hear anyone talking about inflation and the cost of things in a positive light. Yet, Paul took pleasure in those times when the necessities of life were scarce.

Paul goes on to say that he delights in persecutions and difficulties. I don't think anyone delights in any form of persecution, but especially when you read all of the difficulties and persecution that Paul actually went through in **2 Corinthians 11:16-29**, and compare that to the persecutions and difficulties that we go through, it is quite humbling. Imagine being pressed in on every side so much so that there is no escape. It was in those

periods in his life where Paul found delight. Times when his enemies pushed hard against him.

It sounds crazy that someone would be content, delighted, and even thankful for all of the things that Paul listed, but in order to understand Paul's list of thanksgiving, we must look at the second half of the verse. The reason that Paul found delight in those things is because "when I am weak, then I am strong." Notice what Paul says there. He is actually talking about the same time. He is saying that "when" he is weak, "then" he is strong. He isn't saying that he was weak at times and then looking back on the situation "after" I became strong. He is saying that at the time of his greatest weakness, he had his greatest strength.

When life is easy and we have so many great things that we can be thankful for, it becomes easy for us to forget not only who has blessed us with those gifts, but we can begin to forget how important living close to God is. On the other hand, when times are tough and there is constant struggle and unpleasant moments in life, we tend to feel our need for God more and turn to Him. James 4:6-8 says "But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded." When we draw near to God, he draws near to us. James also tells us in James 1:2-4 "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." We can be joyful when we go through various trials and hardships because the result of those trials strengthen us and bring us to spiritual maturity. So, in light of what Paul is truly thankful for, might I propose that we take a moment as well and realize that some of the best times in our lives is actually when we are having trials, because in those trials, the strength of God is seen all the more.
