GODS HANDY WORK

Throughout history, mankind has always tried to predict the weather. Even going back as far as 650 B.C. the ancient Babylonians recorded how they tried to predict short term weather based on the appearance of clouds and optical phenomenon such as how haloes formed around the stars and moon at night. In 340 B.C. Aristotle, the Greek philosopher, wrote four complete volumes on theories about weather. In that book, he had some pretty amazing observations but even more significant errors. Regardless, his books on weather made him the authority on the study and theory of weather for over 2000 years. There have even been countless phrases and poems people have remarked about throughout history, in hopes to predict the weather. Quotes like, "red sky at night, sailor's delight; red sky in the morning, sailors warning." This phrase even goes back to the time of Christ! (Matthew 16:2-3). Books like farmers almanacs were studied in order to predict when to plant crops and what to expect in the upcoming months. Today, we live in a period where science and technology has made it to where we can almost completely predict what can happen. We can watch the news each day to see if a storm is coming or what the temperature might be so we can dress accordingly. Regardless of how poorly people could predict the weather in the past, or how well we can know the change or severity of weather today, one thing that is certain is that weather has always been an agent of God.

In the book of Job, one of his friends, Elihu, actually makes a powerful reference to God and His power to control the weather. Job 37:3-6 says, "Under the whole heaven He lets it go, and His lightning to the corners of the earth. After it His voice roars; He thunders with His majestic voice, and He does not restrain the lightning when His voice is heard. God thunders wondrously with His voice; He does great things that we cannot comprehend. For to the snow He says, 'Fall on the earth,' likewise to the downpour, His mighty downpour." All through scripture, and even in our own lives, we see God using the weather to suit His own purpose. The cycle of seasons, with rain and sun, allows the earth to continue to produce crops for us to eat. This is something that God promised Noah, and the rest of mankind, after the flood. Genesis 8:22 tells us, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

In the book of Exodus, we even see the destruction of Egypt's crops from a hail storm in order to show Pharaoh the power and judgment over Egypt and their wickedness. (Exodus 9:13-35) In Jonah, we read of how God made a storm come upon the sea as Jonah tried to escape in order for His plan for Jonah as a prophet to take place. (Jonah 1:4) In Job 38, God speaks in detail to Job about all the complexities that He has control over when it comes to the weather. In Job 38:25-27 God says, "Who has cleft a channel for the torrents of rain and a way for the thunderbolt, to bring rain on a land where no man is, on the desert in which there is no man, to satisfy the waste and desolate land, and to make the ground sprout with grass?" In this passage, God says to Job that He makes it rain even in the desert, where there is nobody, simply to glorify Himself. In Psalm 148, we read of how all things created on this earth, including the lighting, hail, snow, mist, and stormy winds fulfill His word and proclaim His excellences! Even one of the greatest testimonies that Jesus truly was, and is, the Son of God was when He was able to calm a storm with His voice. Matthew 8:27 tells us that the men on the boat marveled and said, "What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey Him?"

So, the next time you turn on the news and you watch as the radar and satellite shows the pattern of weather approaching. Remember who is truly behind that weather. Look beyond the colors of the images and the meteorologist and realize that you are truly witnessing God's hand at work. Although we may not know all the reason why the weather is the way it is, we can be certain of who is truly in control of it!
