HARD HEADEDNESS

With deer season well under way, and deer on the rut, it brings to mind both the beauty and power of seeing two large bucks square off in a field. They see each other and approach as they begin to snort and size up their opponents. Suddenly, their antlers lower, and their feet begin moving swiftly as they lock up and begin pushing each other in a display of dominance. It is like watching nature's medieval jousting event take place. Maybe you have seen videos or pictures of deer, rams, or even bison participating in this act of dominance and direct opposition to their enemies. You can only imagine how hard headed those animals have to be in order to take on such force. But did you know that we need to be this spiritually hard headed as well?

If you look in Ezekiel, you will see a time where Israel is in complete rebellion. And because of their rebellion, they had become exiles in Babylon along the Chebar river. God did not exile the Israelites just to punish them. Instead, He intended the punishment in Ezekiel's day to be a means to an end and bring Israel to a state of repentance and humility. But that is easier said than done sometimes, and God knew it. Look at what God said to Ezekiel in Ezekiel 3:7 "But the house of Israel will not be willing to listen to you, for they are not willing to listen to me: because all the house of Israel have a hard forehead and a stubborn heart." Israel was stubborn and hard headed. Because of this, they refused to listen to God. So, in the next verse, God says what He is going to do to Ezekiel. Ezekiel 3:8-9 "Behold, I have made your face as hard as their faces, and your forehead as hard as their foreheads. Like emery harder than flint have I made your forehead. Fear them not, nor be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house." The imagery is not so much of antlered animals confronting each other, but of hard-headed saints butting heads with hard-headed sinners.

God's message must be delivered even when we know ahead of time that it will not be easily received, or even received at all. What God told Ezekiel is what He also tells us in **2 Timothy 4:2-5**. The passage says, "preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be soberminded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry."

We live in a world of "political correctness". A world where many, even in the body of Christ, are trying to alter and change the Word of God to please others instead of our Heavenly Father. Our "politically correct" world also often tries to avoid conflicts over rebellion against God's Word. To oppose practices like abortion, homosexuality, and other sinful acts cause us to be labeled as uncaring, unloving, or a bigot. The hard headed world wishes to silence us and the Word of God. The world has no desire to hear it. So what do we do in times like these? Just remember that God makes our head harder their theirs.

We must remember that it is our duty as the Lord's servant to speak out for the truth. Not for our own selfish gain, but to bring others to repentance and to Christ. Although God blesses His people with a hard head, He also blesses them with a soft heart. 2 Timothy 2:24-26 says "And the Lord's servant must not be guarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will." Let us be willing to stand up for the truth and defend the faith while we share the love and desire that God has towards all people.
