GOD'S LIVING WORD

Something that has always truly amazed me about the living word of God is that, even through the most severe persecution throughout history, it has remained indestructible. Even the very material the Bible was originally written on gives testimony to its indestructibility. The first writings were on papyrus, which was very fragile and didn't last long. Yet, there are some 25,000 early manuscripts that are still in existence today. Even hundreds of years before the printing press was invented, it was able to continue pushing on.

We also see how His word continued even in the face of direct persecution. As the first century church began, it was persecuted by the Jews. Many were stoned, imprisoned, beaten, beheaded, or crucified. But, even through the persecution and scattering of Christians from Jerusalem, Acts 8:4 tells us, "Now those who were scattered went about preaching the word." Then, as persecution seems to be getting lighter from the Jews, the Jewish persecution was overshadowed with that of Rome. Roman emperors, like Nero in 64 A.D. came into power. He was known to have Christians sewn into skins of animals and torn to pieces by wild dogs as a spectacle for his guests and other onlookers. Other Christians were burned alive in the streets as human street lights. After Nero, Domitian came into power around 81 A.D. and began to demand that he be worshiped as a god.

For Christians who refused to engage in this kind of worship, they were tortured and killed during his reign. Later on in history, Diocletian came to power in 284 A.D. He made it illegal for Christians to assemble for worship. Churches and homes where churches were found to meet were destroyed. He burned as many copies of the Bible as he could find and would burn the owners in the process. When I read of such persecutions, I can't help but think of what the Hebrew writer said of those who were persecuted for their faith. In, truth "the world was not worthy" of such devout followers of Christ! **Hebrews 11:38.**

Even after the fall of Rome, persecution of God's word and its followers continued. Some even came at the hands of "religious" people. Pope Innocent III in 1199 had Bibles translated in French burned and presses destroyed to keep people from having their own Bibles. Pope Gregory IX, in 1234, did the same. John Wycliffe, in 1383 was considered a heretic and had his English translated Bibles burned. Yet, with all of these efforts and many more throughout history, God's word has continued to be spread. Even skeptics like Voltaire made claims like, "In less than a hundred years the Bible will be discarded and Christianity swept from the earth." However, only fifty years after his death, the Geneva Bible Society used his printing press and house to produce stacks of Bibles.

It seems that the more man has tried to fight against God's word, the more it has stood the test of time. After all, Jesus did say in **Matthew 24:35**, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away." So, why don't you take a moment today and read a portion of God's living word. Take time to truly appreciate God's message to man, and what all it has taken in history to get to you today. The only way for the influence of God's word to be diminished is for us to close our hearts to it, and leave it unread. **Andrew Spivey**
