There are certainly events that take place in our lives, that although they might be devastating or saddening, spark a thought that brings forth the spiritual truths that we have actually always known. With this recent tornado that hit Hendersonville and Gallatin, it has sparked a few of those thoughts.

Even seeing the devastating energy of a tornado and the wreckage that it left behind isn't even comparable to the power that God has. **Nahum 1:3** says this, "The Lord is slow to anger and great in power and the Lord will by no means clear the guilty. His way is in whirlwind and storm, and the clouds are the dust of His feet." Seeing what a storm can do truly puts in perspective the true power of God. **Psalm 147:5** says, "Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; His understanding is beyond measure."

This leads to another reminder about God that was seen in this recent storm. God is truly omniscient. 1 Corinthians 3:19 says, "For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness." As the storm came through and I was watching the news, it was crazy to see how quickly things escalated. When I first began watching, the meteorologists were focused on what seemed to be a tornado moving in Kentucky. Suddenly the storm seemed to build up in Tennessee. It moved from Dickson, it looked like it might hit Nashville. Then, next thing I hear from the TV is that it is heading through Madison and towards Hendersonville. Although we were able to see what was happening from radar and satellite, all the news could do was make predictions as to what was going to happen. But God knew, and God alone is the all knowing One. His understanding is truly beyond measure. Isaiah 40:28 says, "Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable."

This brings up yet another fact about God that we can see from the storm. God is truly omnipresent. **Hebrews** 13:5 tells us, "Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for He has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." One thing that is

certain when this storm took place is that God was present. He was there when we prayed for safety and He was there as the storm came through. Even through the devastation, God was there. And He is with us now as well. And not only is God here for us, but He also has compassion towards us. Jesus said in **Matthew 10:29-31** "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows."

One of the greatest examples of God's compassion and care was seen this past Sunday morning. After the storm and destruction on Saturday, as I was driving to the church building on Sunday morning, I saw a wonderful sight. It is a sight that I see most mornings driving to the office. It is a hawk that hangs out on a power line near Volunteer State. Most days I see him there, sitting and watching the fields. And even after the storms and the tornado, that Sunday morning, there was the hawk. In his usual place. "Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows." Jesus also said in Matthew 6:26, "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" Just as God took care of the hawk, the birds and other animals during that storm, God takes care of us. When Paul addressed the Aeropagus in Athens, he said in Acts 17:25, "nor is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, since He Himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything." Even in the midst of a terrifying storm, we do not have to fear because our God is all knowing, all powerful, always present, and always cares.
