### **MOLE HOLES**

When I look at the work that the mole has done in my yard, and I think of all the work I am going to have to do in order to get it back to how it was, I am reminded of other pests that use the same tactics in our lives. Sin and Satan. He places small temptations and desires in front of us. Nothing too big at first, just enough to catch our attention.

It could be the desire to look at or watch something we know we shouldn't or to justify our words or attitude. It could begin by missing a church service or "taking a break" from our daily Bible reading. Whatever the temptation may be, it begins to work on us gradually and methodically. We begin to get so used to these "small sins" in our lives that we become numb to them. Paul warns Timothy in 1 Timothy 4:1-2, "Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared." That is what these sins and temptations do over time. They begin to sear our conscience to the point that sin no longer bothers us. But we must not be deceived. James 1:14-15 says, "But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death."

Although it may seem like it is no big deal, sin brings forth death. Slowly, but surely, it will being to kill you and eat away at you, and if it is not taken care of, it can completely destroy you. That is why we must constantly be on guard of Satan's schemes. **1 Peter 5:8** says, "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." We must resist him and drive him out of our lives. **Ephesians 6:10-11** tells us how to do that also. It says, "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil." God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it." (**1 Corinthians 10:13**)
