### FORWARD LOOKING

Did you know that it wasn't until 45 B.C. that New Years day was moved to January 1st? Before that time, many celebrated New Years around the middle of March, when crops were planted, or followed a very inaccurate lunar calendar. However, when Julius Caesar became emperor of Rome, he knew that some calendar reforms needed to be made. He worked with astrologers and developed the Julian calendar, predecessor to our Gregorian calendar.

Julius Caesar named the first month January, after the Roman god Janus. January had a special significance for the Romans because of this. Why? Because Janus was a god who had two faces and was believed to be able to both look backwards and forwards in time. So on January 1st beginning in 46 B.C., the Romans began offering sacrifices to Janus and made promises of good conduct for the coming year. Because of this, Janus became the ancient symbol for resolutions. Thus, we find the unique origins of making the New Year's resolution.

It is common for us to look into our own past and see the things we have and haven't done, both good and bad. Sometimes this can be disheartening and can cause us to want to give up or not try and resolve anything to become better. But fortunately for us, I am grateful that we have a "one faced" God. In **Jeremiah 31**, God tells of a new covenant that will come, and in verse **34** it says, "And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

It is such a great blessing to have a God who only remembers the time after forgiveness. **Romans 6:4** says, "We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." Not only are we blessed with forgiveness, but with a new life! Just as God forgives us and no longer remembers our sins, He wants us to do the same. We tend to beat ourselves up over "forgiven sin," when in God's mind there is no such thing. How can God forgive something that no longer exists to Him?

This is what Paul is talking about in **Philippians 3:13-14**, "Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on

toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

We truly have a forward looking God who looks forward to when we are in heaven with Him. Let us look forward to the life God has called us to live in Christ Jesus, leaving behind all that holds us back from this goal. As we begin this New Year, resolve to have a mind that is forward thinking. Focusing on the eternal prize of Heaven, and unity with our Heavenly Father. Let us also resolve to no longer waste our time, but instead keep our eyes set upon the wisdom and truth of the word of God. Ephesians 5:15-16 says, "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." Just as Christ redeemed us by His death on the cross (Galatians 3:13) let us make sure that we use our redeemed time to share the good news about Him. The good news that makes us new.

2 Corinthians 5:16-17 says, "From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."
