### **SNOW DAYS**

It was the first time in quite a few years I can remember us getting more than a light dusting, and it was so much fun getting to go outside and play in the snow with Palmer, at least until our noses got too cold. Seeing the snow fall was also such a beautiful sight and it is also a great reminder of God's great creation. As a matter of fact, Job 37:6-7 says, "For to the snow he says, 'Fall on the earth,' likewise to the downpour, his mighty downpour. He seals up the hand of every man, that all men whom he made may know it." This is so true about snow. When it falls, we all can't help but to stop what we are doing and watch it. To see how it starts off being so small and slow floating down to the earth then slowly accumulating to coat the landscape in beautiful white sheets. Snow truly does show us God's great creative power.

Not only does snow show how powerful our God is, it is a great representation of the power of His love. Isaiah 1:18 says, "Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool." Although we are sinners, Christ died for us in order for our sins to be washed away and for us to be made white as snow(Romans 5:8). In Psalm 51:7 it reads, "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow." This passage teaches that snow illustrates forgiveness and the covering up all that is dirty and ugly. Think about it, yards and fields with dry, brown, short grass is not very pretty to look at. Trees with all the leaves gone can look pretty sad as well, but once a blanket of snow covers them it becomes beautiful. Even trash piles become pretty white mounds when snow covers them.

If we read in **Psalm 51:1-4** we find out why David said this. David was not able to cover his

sins on his own. He tried to cover up his sins but instead of them going away, they only got worse. They continued to eat at his conscience. **Psalm 32:3-4** says, "For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer."

David failed miserably at trying to cover up and hide his sins, but he knew who he could turn to who could help him. **Psalm 32:5** says, "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin." It was only God who could truly forgive and cover the sins of David.

What about you right now? Are there things in your life that you have tried to cover up on your own? Maybe you have been trying to save yourself by your own works or deeds? There is only one way for those sins to be covered. Ephesians 4:5 says, "one Lord, one faith, one baptism." The only way our sins can ever be truly covered is through baptism in Christ. In 1 Peter 3:21-22, Peter compares baptism to the global flood and how Noah was saved on the ark. He then says, "Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him."

So, as you see the snow falling from the heavens and covering the earth, remember the power and love our Father in Heaven has for us and his continual cleansing for all who are faithful to Him. "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin." (1 John 1:7)
