ENDURE THE RACE

It's a scene that has been shown in countless TV shows and sports movies over the years. From old episodes of Leave it to Beaver and movies like The Little Giants or Facing the Giants, I am sure you have seen it play out in one way or another. Imagine a young boy on a football field. He isn't the biggest, and you can tell by the look on his face that he is scared. Suddenly, the ball is snapped and the quarterback throws the ball. The kid catches it, and for a split second, there is sheer terror on his face as he sees the opposing team rushing towards him. But, all of a sudden, behind the wall of defenders and standing behind the end zone is the boy's father. He just made it in from his business trip and his son is so excited to see him that he just starts running. His eyes are fixed on his dad as he rushes towards the end zone. He slips past one, two, three defenders, all the while he is still focused on his dad. As he runs into the end zone and scores a touchdown, his whole team cheers and celebrates. But he runs straight through the end zone and into his father's arms.

It is a perfect ending to a heart-felt sports movie. But did you know that a similar scene is given to us in the Bible? Hebrews 12:1-2 says, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." The Hebrew writer was concerned about these Christians turning their backs and returning to their former ways. At the time this was written, the Jews were persecuting the church and these Jewish converts were suffering in many ways. They were becoming outcasts to their own families and communities, arrested, thrown in prison, beaten, and even killed. All because they were following Christ. As you can imagine, the temptation to give up Christianity and go back to their old way of living must have been intense. So, they needed reminding that what they have with Christ is far greater than what they had before, even with the persecutions and suffering. What it came down to was a matter of perspective of what they needed to keep in front of them.

How is it that Christians can persevere when things become difficult? How do we endure when we go through various trials, hardships, and sufferings? The answer is what the Hebrew writer told us. Fix your eyes on Jesus. See, it is much more than simply having Christ over to the side and glancing at Him every now and then. Instead we need to make sure our attention is completely focused on Him. And we do that by purposefully turning away from and going past the weights and sins that keep us distracted from Christ. Colossians 3:1-2 says, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth."

By fixing our eyes on Jesus, and setting our minds on the things above where Christ is, it gives us a goal, a purpose, and a path by which we can get there. Hebrews tells us that when we see Jesus, we are seeing the One who went to the cross, even despising its shame, and endured through the suffering because there was something so desirable about the outcome. Because, through His sacrifice, He is able to bring us to Himself. He is the founder and perfecter of our faith. And as long as we look to Him and follow the path He has laid before us, we can have assurance of our victory as well. Just like that little boy on the field, when we look to Jesus, all of our enemies fade away and all we see is victory. As Paul asked in Romans **8:35**, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?" "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."
