CONSISTENT OR INCONSISTENT

Think back to your childhood for a moment. Was there ever a time when you were sitting in a classroom listening to the teacher when they were suddenly called away? What would happen next? I don't know about you but I know what I did. I was always the first to talk, make a funny noise, or throw something at one of my friends. This would then turn the entire class into an uproar and when the teacher came back the class was out of control. Now, I was never a trouble maker. I might have been one of the class clowns, but I never gave the teachers any trouble. I was actually always very close to my teachers, but my behavior when they left the room was not consistent with my behavior when they were in the class.

Sadly, that struggle never seems to go away. Of course, we eventually learn how to behave when a teacher leaves the room, but we still live a life full of inconsistencies. Parents struggle being consistent on discipline. Workers struggle being consistent when the boss is not around. We are not consistent on how we handle situations in life. These inconsistencies are extremely troublesome as a Christian.

When we are baptized in Christ, we assume that all of our human self is washed away and that life will be easier. However, those inconsistencies never leave. We end up behaving differently when we are at church than we do when we are out in the world. We begin to criticize others for their anger, racism, nasty posts, hateful or foul speech, but we turn around and do the same thing. We condemn lying and lie the first chance we can to get out of something. Just because we are a Christian does not mean we are consistent. This is something Peter, Cephas, struggled with as well. Galatians 2:11-14 shows that Peter was being inconsistent and was behaving in quite a racist way. The passage reads, "But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. For before certain men came from James, he was eating with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

Notice what verse 11 said. It said that Peter stood condemned. Do we stand condemned as well? Romans 2:1-3 reads, "Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. Do you suppose, O manyou who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God?" I am afraid that many times in our lives, we hold others to a standard of perfection, but give ourselves a pass for falling short in the same place others do. But as we just saw in this verse, we have no excuse for being inconsistent. If it is wrong for others to do then it is wrong for us as well. The only way to be consistent in life is to follow the word of God and allow that word to lead your path. 1 Corinthians 15:58 says, "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." Let us make sure that our work is consistent with our Word. If not, it is God's name that takes the blame (Romans 2:24). **Andrew Spivey**
