GRATITUDE

One afternoon, two friends met each other on the street. One of them looked quite disgruntled, almost to the point of tears it seemed. His friend asked him, "What has happened to you to make you so upset?" The man responded, "Let me tell you. Three weeks ago, my uncle died and he left me forty thousand dollars." "That's a lot of money", the friend responded. "But that's not all. Two weeks ago, a cousin that I never even knew died, and left me with eighty-five thousand dollars." The friend replied, "It sounds to me that you have been very blessed." The frustrated friend responded, "You don't understand! Last week my great aunt passed away and I inherited a quarter million dollars from her." At this point, the man's friend was quite confused. "Then why do you look so aggravated and upset?" he asked. "This week...I got nothing!"

Sometimes, we can get to the point in our lives where we begin to expect to get certain blessings that God never promised to us, and when we do not receive them, it becomes easy to get bitter and complain. We all know that complaining is not a good thing, but have you ever thought of how bad complaining really is? Paul say's in Ephesians 4:29, "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." When reading this verse, it is easy to look at the obvious and see that we shouldn't use foul language or rude, degrading talk. But have you ever thought that corrupting talk includes complaining? Growing up, I never thought of complaining as being something "corrupting," but as we look further into scripture, we can easily see that murmuring, grumbling, and complaining can pollute our lives and those around us.

First of all, complaining is sinful. It also causes many people all kinds of problems in their lives and robs the joy of anyone listening. Scripture gives us plenty of examples of the dangers of complaining as well. For example, in 1 Corinthians 10, Paul begins teaching the readers that the events that took place in the Old Testament are examples for us in what we should not do. He talks about how the Israelites at Mt. Sinai built a golden calf and practiced idolatry. He mentions how twenty- three thousand people died in one day because they indulged in sexual immorality. Then, in

1 Corinthians 10:10-11, Paul says, "nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. Now these things happened to them as an

example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come." Obviously, idolatry and sexually immorality are sinful, but complaining? In **James 5:9**, it says "Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door."

It is obvious that God doesn't take lightly to complaining, yet how quick are we to become impatient and begin to complain? We complain when we are stuck in traffic or in line at a grocery store. We are quick to point out the faults of friends or family members. We even complain about our job when we should be grateful to have one. We complain when the blessings that God has been giving us become expectations that we demand. We complain when other people don't do what we would have done. We live in a society full of critics and complainers. So how do we make sure that we do not get brought in by this negative and toxic attitude? The best antidote for complaining is thankfulness. Those who are truly thankful do not complain. They are too busy being grateful for all the good things that they have so there is no time to notice the things they could complain about. 1 Thessalonians 5:18 says, "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Instead of being bitter and complaining, we should be rejoicing for all that God has blessed us with. You and I need to make it a daily goal to live a life of thanksgiving. Let's be as positive and grateful as possible.

Try going to bed at night and ponder everything you have to be thankful for. Let it be the very first thing you do in the morning as well. Thank God for the little things or things you might normally take for granted. Things as simple as a parking place, getting up for work, having a quick meal, your family or friends. When times get difficult and we start to complain or grumble about our situation, don't get discouraged and throw in the towel either. Keep at it each and every day until you have developed new habits and are living with an attitude of gratitude. On top of that, be generous with your gratitude. Colossians 3:17 says, "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."
