It is a dangerous thing to go into the world being spiritually hungry. 1 John 2:15-17 says, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world-the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life-is not from the Father but is from the world. And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever." Instead of trying to feast on the desires of the world, we must fill ourselves with His word and actively pursue Christ in our lives. Proverbs 8:17 says, "I love those who love me, and those who seek me diligently find me." We must be active in seeking God in our lives and only then can we truly be filled. Only then will we not have buyer's remorse.
