RIP CURRENTS

This past week was quite chaotic with all of the storms and flooding. It was crazy to see how quickly the creeks were able to rise and people were soon trapped in their houses because of flood waters. I remember hearing the reporters on the news encouraging people to stay off of the roads and to stay out of the water. They kept repeating the fact that it only takes six inches of water to sweep a person off their feet and it only takes one to two feet of water to float a vehicle off of its wheels. As crazy as that seems, I certainly believe it to be true. As a matter of fact, I would argue to say that it only takes one inch of water, in the right conditions to take your feet out from under you.

For example, a few weeks ago when my family was able to go to Taylor's home town of Stuart, Florida. We went to the beach one morning for Palmer to collect shells. Being on the Atlantic ocean, the waves were very large and would sweep up extremely far on the beach. Then Taylor told me to make sure that I kept Palmer back from the water. When I asked why she said that there was a bad rip current. She even showed me how I could tell there was a rip current by the patterns the waves made in the sand. Then as we stood at the edge of the water and felt the waves hit against our ankles, we could stand still and feel our feet begin to sink into the sand as the rip current pulled against the shore line.

Rip currents are actually very dangerous. Even though they only move about two or three feet per second, they are stronger than any Olympic swimmer. They can pull you off your feet and quickly sweep you out into the ocean. Actually, rip currents are the cause of over 100 deaths every year in America alone. Last year, there were over 11 deaths on Florida's gulf coast in just two weeks when a period of strong rip currents hit the beaches. When you compare that to an average of one death per year by shark attack, you begin to realize the hidden killer isn't in the water. The hidden killer is the water.

When I think of the danger of rip currents, or of the sudden flooding we had last week, I am also reminded of the many temptations that we face ourselves. How often do we see temptation and feel as though we will be ok to dabble in sin and then escape from its deadly effects just in time. Even though we have clear warning, we feel as though we will be fine. **James 1:14-15** says, "But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. Then desire when it has conceived gives

birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death." We are also told in **Galatians 6:7-8**, "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life."

We have clear knowledge and warnings of the rip current effect sin has on us, yet time and time again we underestimate the power and draw of sin. And before we know it, we can quickly be drawn in and swept away. Paul warns us about the power of temptation and sin. Galatians 6:1 says, "Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted." Paul tells us that even if we are strong enough to confront the sins of our brothers and sisters, we must make sure that we guard ourselves as well against sin. We all have different temptations that can quickly pull us away, but we also have the ability to either avoid those temptations or get out of those temptations as well. Paul goes on to tell us how we can get out of our temptations. Much like how I was able to hold onto Taylor and Palmer to keep them safe in the waves, Paul says in Galatians 6:2 "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." We can lean on each other in our times of need and in order to get out of our temptations.

Most importantly, we can lean upon God and know that he will provide us a way to avoid and escape the current of sin. 1 Corinthians 10:12-13 says, "Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it." So let us remember to always be alert of the dangers of sin and temptation, let us not be confident in ourselves but confident in Christ and lean upon Him and each other to both avoid and get out of the temptations we have. Remember not to stick your toes into temptation and think that you **Andrew Spivey** can get out.
