MILE MARKERS

With summer starting and Memorial day here, many people are planning family vacations and traveling to visit family. I imagine that many of the Buc-ee's gas stations will be rather busy over the next few months as people travel around. I find it funny that over the past few years Buc-ee's has quickly become a marker for our family trips. They have them perfectly located at the half way point for us going to Gatlinburg, and they have a few placed on our way to Florida as well. So no matter which way we go, Buc-ee's works as a mile marker for my family. But that hasn't always been the case. I can remember as a child, before having GPS in our car we would have to either use a map or print out directions on MapQuest.

I can remember following those directions with me and my brother looking out the window for the next mile marker to know both where we were and when we need to turn. Each marker we passed was just a sign that we were one mile closer to where we needed to be. Even in ancient times, people used markers as a way to make sure they were on the right path. Although the ancient Romans didn't have Buc-ee's to judge their distance or bright green markers with numbers to tell where they were, they did have "milestones". Along the roman roads, they would place these milestones with the name of the current Caesar of the time and the distance to the next town or village. As a matter of fact, some of these milestones are around today and can still be seen. But why is this so important?

Well, because milestones mark a significant point has been reached and point to the next place. When the nation of Israel first crossed the Jordan river, they placed "milestones". Joshua 4:5-7 says, "And Joshua said to them, "Pass on before the ark of the Lord your God into the midst of the Jordan, and take up each of you a stone upon his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the people of Israel, that this may be a sign among you. When your children ask in time to come, 'What do those stones mean to you?' then you shall tell them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord. When it passed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. So these stones shall be to the people of Israel a memorial forever."

Those stones marked an important moment in their journey to the land that God had promised them. A moment that was so important that they were even told that they were to teach their children about what had happened that day. Those twelve stones were a mark of a promise that God had fulfilled. A promise that He would allow them access into the Promise land. This was something that even Joseph had talked about and looked forward to. Hebrews 11:13 says, "These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth." Verse 22 goes on to tell us, "By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones." This shows us the confidence that Joseph had in God's promise.

But this gets me to thinking, what milestones do we have in our lives? When we look back on our lives and we see all of the different markers and paths we have been. When we align those with God's word, are we able to see a life that has been lived in faith and a path that had been laid out and established by God? Because if you really think about it, each milestone prepares us for the next. Think back to Israel, when they first left Egypt, they were not prepared to enter the Promised land. Before entering they had to go through 40 years in the wilderness and a life of learning to trust God before they were ready to cross the Jordan river. The same is true when it comes to us maturing in our faith. We must be preparing for our own crossing of the Jordan into our land of rest.

If our life is truly lived in faith to God, then each moment prepares us for the next. And only if we continue to follow the markers that God has established will we truly be able to say as Paul said in 2 Timothy 4:7-8 "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing."

As memorial day is upon us and summer traveling begins, I would like to encourage you to take a moment and look at a few of the memorial stones in your spiritual life. Reflect on all the work that God has done for you. Look at where you are now compared to where you were then. Are you closer to God more now than ever? Or maybe you have been straying from the path and you need to look back to the rock of our salvation to get back on the right track. But if we are able to follow the path of righteousness, the path established by our Savior, then we can one day meet death as simply a milestone along the path to our eternal home of rest and peace.
