COMFOUNDED

I am so grateful for everyone here, at Nashville Road, who made this year's Vacation Bible School a success. Thank you to all of the teachers, participants, and volunteers who put in countless hours in order for us to share the wonderful account of Paul and the pathways he took to follow Christ. It is amazing to see a man who was the one guarding the coats of those who stoned Stephen and one who was in agreement to putting the first century Christians in prison and to death, (Acts 8:1-3) And to see such an immediate transition in his life.

When Saul was baptized into Christ, what an enormous change his life made. And everyone knew it also. Acts 9:18-21 says, "Then he rose and was baptized; and taking food, he was strengthened. For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. And immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is the Son of God." And all who heard him were amazed and said. "Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem of those who called upon this name? And has he not come here for this purpose, to bring them bound before the chief priests?" Saul was widely known as the one who was persecuting the early church so when people heard him proclaiming Christ for the first time, they were amazed. It must have been a very difficult reality to believe and accept the fact that this man, who was such a great persecutor of the Way, was now one who was proclaiming the Way!

A verse that stands out when it comes to Saul's conversion and sudden change in his actions and teaching is in Acts 9:22, "But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ." Saul confounded them by his conversion and teaching. Have you ever confounded anyone? Maybe when you first came to Christ, was there anyone who knew you before who was confounded by the change in your life? Maybe someone who knew you growing up who might see you now and have a hard time believing that it is really you.

It is the act of true repentance and being fruitful in God's Kingdom that brings forth such a confounded response. A good contrast to this is actually found in Matthew 3. When John was preaching and baptizing by the Jordan river there were some Pharisees and Sadducees who came to be baptized by him. But, John in no way was confounded because there wasn't any true change in their lives. They were the same people that they had always been. In Matthew 3:7 says,

"But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?" John then tells them what they truly need to do. In Matthew 3:8 John tells them to "Bear fruit in keeping with repentance." See, when someone truly repents and is baptized in Christ, they cannot continue to live as if they are the same person that they once were. If they do so, they may "confound" people in a negative wav.

It is a tragic thing to confound someone by how you act or talk and when they find out you are a Christian they respond with, "Wow! I never would have guessed you were a Christian!" That is certainly not a good way to confound someone. Instead, let us make sure that if we are to have anyone feel confounded by us, it should be with the gospel truth! It should surprise others when they see our kindness and love, and it should want to make them desire to seek God in their own lives as well. They will know we are Christians by our love and it will confound them and surprise them that we are not like the rest of the world because we are no longer of the world. Romans 12:1-2.
