EASIER SAID THAN DONE (part 2)

In 2 Samuel 11:2, we see where that temptation begins for David. The passage says, "It happened, late one afternoon, when David arose from his couch and was walking on the roof of the king's house, that he saw from the roof a woman bathing; and the woman was very beautiful." Neither were doing anything wrong. David was doing what he normally did as a king, walking around and looking at his kingdom. Bathsheba was doing what she was supposed to do as well. We see in verse 4 that she was completing her purification rites that God had commanded of women in Leviticus 15. But when David saw her, his own lust began to rule in his heart. Even when he found out who she was married to it didn't stop him because he was so enticed and that enticement carried him to go forward in sin. This is not unlike the sexual struggles in this day and age. With social media and internet websites, it becomes easier for men and women to lust after others and as it enters into our hearts it can destroy men, women, and entire families. When David chose to act on his desires of the flesh, he conceived and gave birth to sin.

The line was crossed and the door was opened in David's heart which became the source of all the sins that followed. The sin of lying and trying to cover up what he had done by sending Uriah back to Bathsheba and then the sin of sending Uriah to the front line and having him killed. As James said, "when sin is fully grown, it brings forth death." Think about how powerful full grown sin is. Think of Joseph's brothers. We see in Genesis 37 that when his father gave him a coat of many colors, **verse 4** says that when they saw how much Jacob loved Joseph, "they hated him and could not speak peacefully to him." They continued to be envious of the coat and what it represented, along with the dreams that Joseph had and as sin became full grown in them, some of his brothers even wanted to kill him. They became callous as well. When they finally sold Joseph into slavery, they brought back his coat that they tore and covered in blood and gave it to their father. They watched as their father grieved the loss of his son and the callousness brought on by the sin in their lives kept them from telling the truth. Because the brothers had already given birth to sin by getting rid of Joseph, the sin continued to grow and add more sin in their lives by

lying to their father and continuing to cover up what they had actually done.

Isaiah 30:1 says, "Ah, stubborn children," declares the Lord "who carry out a plan, but not mine, and who make an alliance, but not of my Spirit, that they may add sin to sin." As sin grows in our lives, it makes us become callous and stubborn, and all it does is stack more sins on top of it. Sins to cover up what we have done and sins to justify our actions. But those sins can be avoided. For David, all he needed to do was to remember the words of God that he stored up in his heart. If he would have remembered what he had studied from the life of Joseph, maybe he wouldn't have done what he did. If only he would have remembered what Joseph said to Potiphar's wife in Genesis 39:9, "How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" As said all along, some things are easier said than done.

So does that mean we are hopeless or does that mean we have no chance? Even though we know how to keep from having temptation in our lives by studying God's word, does that mean we are doomed to follow the same path of Joseph's brothers and David? By no means! Although temptation is brought on because of our own desires, we still have an escape.

1 Corinthians 10:13 tells us, "No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation He will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it." God will help us overcome all temptations that come our way. Not only that, but He gave us the greatest escape by sending His own son to die for us. Full grown sin brings forth death and there is no way around that, but God has a gift for those who want an escape. Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Andrew Spivey
