TRUTH SEEKERS AND ACTS

We are certainly proud of our Truth Seekers and all the work they have done in their study of memory verses and their study and memorization of the book of Acts. The knowledge they have gained through their study of Acts is something that is of extreme value and importance. **Proverbs 16:16** says, "How much better to get wisdom than gold! To get understanding is to be chosen rather than silver." But what makes the book of Acts such an important book for our young people to learn and memorize, and why should we encourage all of our young people to become more involved in our Truth Seekers? Well, by looking at what they have learned in Acts, we can see the answer to both these questions and why we should love this book.

From the first account of conversion in chapter 2, we see the steps involved and required to become a Christian, which we then see duplicated time after time throughout the book. Having heard the gospel of Jesus Christ preached to them (Romans 10:14), including His death, burial and resurrection as taught in Acts 2:22-36; (1 Corinthians 15:1-4), those who were receptive were "cut to the heart" as they believed the message of Christ preached to them as seen in Acts 2:37. In order to receive "the forgiveness of sins," which they so desperately needed, they were to "repent" (Luke 13:3) and "be baptized" (Mark 16:16) As we see in Acts 2:38. Not everyone chose to change their ways and give their lives to the Lord, but Acts 2:41 says that, "those who gladly received his word were baptized" in order that they might be "saved" (1 Peter 3:21) and became a "disciple of Christ" (Matthew 28:19).

The teachings of Christ had been followed precisely and the pattern of salvation had been clearly laid out. Throughout the rest of the book, "many" were "obedient to the faith" (Acts 6:7), by following the exact same steps. When individuals "<u>heard</u>" the gospel preached (Acts 8:6, 35; 9:6; 10:34-43; 16:13-14, 32; 18:8; 19:5), they "<u>believed</u>" that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (Acts

8:12, 37; 9:42; 10:43; 15:7; 11:21; 13:6-12, 48; 14:1; 16:31; 17:12, 34; 18:8), they "<u>repented</u>" of their sins (Acts 3:19; 22:16; 11:18; 16:33; 17:30), they "<u>confessed</u>" their faith in Jesus Christ (Acts 8:36-38), and they were "<u>baptized</u>" in order to have their sins washed away by the blood of Jesus and become a New Testament Christian (Acts 8:12, 13, 16, 36, 38; 9:18; 22:16; 10:47-48; 16:15, 33; 18:8; 19:5).

This is why we need to love and study the book of Acts, in order to see the clear plan of salvation that was both taught and then obeyed, in order to be added to Christ and His church. That plan has not changed so we need to teach it and obey it! If you would like to learn of all the great news that can be found in Acts, make sure to talk to one of our Truth Seekers!
