GIVE YOUR BURDENS UP

Sometimes in the really difficult situations in life, it's hard to want to keep going. It can be tempting to want to give up, quit or check out. So how do you keep going when life gets hard?

I know many times in my life, when facing various struggles, I would try to turn to friends as many do. However, I would sometimes find myself even more discouraged because I did this. Why? Well have you ever been trying to tell a friend something and they were simply not paying attention? Either they kept changing the subject, they were focused on what they were doing and not what you were saying, or they simply wouldn't get off their cell phone. Instead of paying attention to you their attention was focused elsewhere, and they didn't hear a word you said. This trend can be seen throughout our lives in family, friends, and peers. Whether it is a parent ignoring a child who is pulling on their leg yelling "look at me", to a co worker or boss who refuses to listen to a warning given by a fellow employee. We see distracted people everywhere. With so many who don't pay attention to us, it is easy for us to begin to assume that God is same way. We ask ourselves, "Why would God listen to me? After all He has to listen to everyone else." I am here to tell you that mindset couldn't be further from the truth.

God isn't like people you know that get distracted and don't listen. Instead, He is present and attentive when you face difficulty. He is there ready to be your refuge and strength and to help you through whatever you're facing, no matter how difficult. **Psalm 46:1** says, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." This is a great passage and we need to take it seriously, as many of us do. We see from this passage that we need to go to God when we have struggles, but how do we do that? **Psalm 55:22** says, "Cast your burden on the Lord, and He will sustain you; He will never permit the righteous to be moved."

This verse gives us some ideas of what we can do when we get discouraged. It tells us to cast our burden on the Lord. When we carry our burdens, we get tired and weary, but if we instead go to God with our burdens, we find strength. Today, regardless of what you're going through, know that you can make it. God will sustain you and help you through it. Go to God with your worries, fears, and troubles and see God come through for you. As **Psalm 37:5** says, "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in Him, and He will act."

Some of you are probably saying that you have gone to God before and it didn't help. You are thinking that there is no hope for you and that no-one will listen. But if that is the case did you really bring your burdens to God and commit your way to Him? When you were struggling with a relationship, a test, a job interview, a death of a dear friend or family member, or mental struggles, did you really just give them to God and not worry about them anymore or did you just pray and then go right back to dwelling on it? If you did the second, then you didn't actually give it to God. One of the most amazing things that I find about God is that what He says is a guarantee. So if you do not get the results that God has promised then that means you didn't do all that He required. If you want to get rid of your burdens, God will listen and He will take them from you, but you have to be willing to give them over. You have to be willing to say that it is no longer in your will but in His. You must be willing to truly let go and let God control your life. 1 Peter 5:6-10 says, "Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time He may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you. Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you."
