SPIRITUAL LIFE

The past week and a half was quite a joyful time for my family. Over our trip, we got to drive along and even hike in some of the most beautiful mountains. However, getting to some of those locations were rather challenging. As we drove through West Virginia, I never realized that it could take you over an hour just to go 15 miles. But that is how it is when you are driving around the mountains. After spending so much time driving through the valleys, in between massive mountains, and climbing to beautiful mountain peaks, I began to think of all the mountaintops and valleys we have in our spiritual lives.

You know, our spiritual lives are not always characterized by wonderful mountaintop experiences. One, both spiritual and physical, example of this is from Moses. As wonderful of an experience it must have been for him to be on the top of Mt. Sinai and in the presence of God, Moses eventually had to leave that mountain peak and come back to the reality of dealing with the Israelites worshiping the golden calf and rebelling. (Exodus 32:15-21)

Elijah had a similar problem when he went against the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel. When fire came from heaven and burned up Elijah's sacrifice that was soaked in water, there was no doubt the Lord was God.

(1 Kings 18:20-40) However, when he came down from that mountaintop, he was overwhelmed with both the death threats of Jezebel and the sinfulness of Israel. We soon find Elijah asking God to take him because he felt like he was the only faithful person left in all the land.

(1 Kings 19:1-10)

Mountaintop experiences truly are amazing, and there are times in our lives when we are able to experience great spiritual victories and we feel as if we are on top of the world, with a breath taking view of our heavenly father. Maybe it was the day when you first obeyed the gospel, witnessed or aided in a friend or family member being baptized into Christ, or maybe it was a mission trip, or a camp that made you feel on fire for God. Maybe it is one of those moments in worship where you feel so inspired and encouraged that you completely forget about all of the distractions and hardships of daily life. Whatever it may be, those mountaintop experiences are certainly a blessing from God and a way to see Him more clearly.

But, much like the physical mountains in the world, life always has deep valleys that we must travel through once we leave the mountaintop. Our spiritual lives, much like a mountain chain, often has more valleys than it does mountain peaks. Situations develop and doubts and fears begin to shake and threaten our faith. But we must not be afraid or feel despair when we are in the valleys of life. Psalm 95:4-6 says, "In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land. Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker!" We must remember that the same God who created the mountains and valleys, is the same God that we can turn to when we are in our own spiritual valleys.

We all have valleys in life, but if we are in Christ, we have something that others do not. These words are best explained by David in Psalm 23:1-4, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." We are blessed with a shepherd who leads us through the valleys in life and comforts us so we do not have to be afraid. Jesus says in John 16:33, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart: I have overcome the world." We have a savior who has overcome the world and he has provided a way to make out of the valleys in life and back to the mountaintop experience.
