BLESSINGS FROM THE RAIN

With the past several weeks being so hot and dry, it has been nice to have the recent rain. However, even with the blessings of rain, it can seem at times that rain can be frustrating to our plans and activities. Baseball games and practices can be rained out, lawn mowing gets postponed, and outdoor activities get cut short. Although rain can be disappointing at times, when we take a step back and take a pause, rain gives us a good reminder of many of the characteristics of God.

For example, rain should remind us of the providence of God. Matthew 5:45 tells us. "For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." Acts 14:17 also says, "Yet he did not leave himself without witness, for he did good by giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, satisfying your hearts with food and gladness." When we look at the rain, we should remember that it is only through God's providence that we receive such a blessing. Rain should also remind us that God is replenishing the earth. **Psalm 147:8** says, "He covers the heavens with clouds; he prepares rain for the earth; he makes grass grow on the hills. Job 5:10 also says, "he gives rain on the earth and sends waters on the fields:" The rain should also remind us of the food that God produces for us through that rain. Isaiah 55:10 says, "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater." Think about it, every single thing that we eat relies on water from the rain. When you begin to think about it, rain truly is one of the most amazing, life giving, blessings that God provides on this earth.

But rain doesn't just provides us with reminders of how much God blesses us. Rain is also a reminder of how serious sin is. In **Genesis 6:5** we read, of how "The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." Because of the sinfulness of the world, God determined to destroy the world with water, saving only Noah and his family, in order to protect and preserve the creatures of the earth. In **Genesis 7:4** we read what God says to Noah. "For in seven days I will send rain on the earth forty days and forty nights, and every living thing that I have made I will blot out from the face of the ground." Sin is serious, it is so serious that the very act of sin caused Him to regret ever creating man and destroying the world by rain and water. And, although rain reminds us of how serious sin is, it also reminds us of How much God loves us.

Peter says in 1 Peter 3:20-22, "because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him." Just as God was willing to save man through Noah, God desires to save us though His Son. 2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." Just as God's patience waited in the days of Noah, God is being patient towards us, hoping that we would humble ourselves before Him, repent of our sins, and be baptized into Christ.

Rain is also a reminder for us that God answers prayers. James tells us in James 5:16-18, "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. Then he praved again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit." This passage has always stood out to me, not only as an example of the power of prayer but that James explains Elijah as a man like us. It is so easy for us to read about certain people and events in the Bible and think, "well of course, they could do it." But we forget that the men and women that we read of in the Bible were people just like us. And if God was willing to do all that He did for them, how much is He willing to do in your life as well? Think of what all He has already provided to you with the rain, and think of how many more blessings He will continue to shower upon you when you come to Him.
