#### THE RACE

Last Sunday was the closing ceremony of the 2024 Olympics. The oldest sporting event in history. It is amazing to think that the ancient Greeks started the games all the way back in 776 B.C. and looked forward to these events so much that they began to record their time in Olympiads, a period of 4 years. Each time the Olympics came around, they would compete in sports like wrestling, discus, pentathlons, and races of various lengths. However, the first marathon would not be held in the Olympics until 1896. Although they did not have marathons in the ancient Olympic games, they still had many various marathon like runs, including the original marathon that took place in 490 B.C.

The Bible even gives mention of events like this in comparison to our own spiritual journey. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises selfcontrol in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified." The Hebrew writer also speaks of the spiritual race that is before us. He writes in Hebrews 12:1-2, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

We must remember that our life is a race to receive a crown of glory. Far too many Christians see their lives as simply "strolling" through their years on this earth. It is not a stroll, it is a race! Think of all of those involved in the races in Paris or in previous Olympic years, they have spent many years of their lives in intense training, not just taking a walk.

The participants in the Olympics have spent years to be able to run a race which often ends in minutes or even seconds. There is no victory without training. In ancient days, the contestants assembled and took a solemn oath before their gods that they had done no less than ten months training and that they would not resort to any trickery to win. In a similar fashion, our race involves

dedicated training and keeping of rules for the race to our crown. In ancient training, they often strapped weights to their bodies, but the day of the actual race they removed the weights and felt so much lighter during the race. This is why the Hebrew writer made the comparison of the weights and sins in life that we cling to or carry along with us. Are there weights in your life that are hindering you in your race?

In the Olympics, there are also spectators. The entire world is watching these people run. In a similar way, we have spectators watching us. Although the witnesses in Hebrews 12 are referring to those great men and women of faith in Hebrews 11, and their example to us, we are also an example to others. Our friends, family, children, and those we meet every day are watching us. As you run your race, keep in mind the impact you have on those around you who are watching. Matthew 5:16 says, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

But why is how we run this race so important? Because a crown is waiting for us. But it isn't a crown made of ivy, or some kind of ribbon, or even Gold.

2 Timothy 4:8 tells us it is a crown of righteousness.

1 Peter 5:4 says it is a crown of glory. And Revelation 2:10 tells us it is a crown of life. Are you running to obtain it? It starts by following Christ. Following His example and obeying His call to be baptized into His death. Then we must win the race that He ran. We cannot just stroll aimlessly through life, and we cannot give up right at the end either. We cannot retire from the race when we are so close to the finish. Keep your eyes on Him through every trial as you complete your race.
