You might be a casual fan. You love the game and you have a team, but you don't have a closet full of one particular color. You simply enjoy the sport and, in the end, don't truly care who wins or loses. It is something to pass the time and talk about. But, once the game is over you don't really think about it until the next weekend rolls around and its back on TV.

Or you might be the "I can't stand football season" kind of fan. You despise it as you get dragged to every sporting event, or every time it is on TV. You act like you're a fan around your family and friends but, in the end you can't wait for it all to be over and everyone can move on with their lives. Sure, you can clap and cheer with the rest of them, but in truth you have zero interest in it at all.

Now, I don't want to pass any judgment on how much of a football fan you are. In truth, I can sympathize with every single level of fandom, and I have probably been each one of them at some point in my life. But I would like to ask you one more question, in light of looking at what kind of football fan you may be...if you were to compare your enthusiasm that you have for football to that of your Christian life, what kind of fan would you be? involved, working and pushing along as you can? Are you the casual Christian who doesn't think much of it until the weekend? Or are you the "I can't stand it" Christian? One who puts on a good show for the others but truly has no interest?

I also have another question, that could answer the previous question. When football season comes around, what do you talk about most to your friends and family? Jesus tells us in **Matthew 6:24** that "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other." Jesus also told the church at Laodicea in **Revelation 3:15-16** "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."

Now, don't get me wrong. I am not saying that you have to hate football in order to follow Christ. But, if you are one of those die hard or faithful fans, have you ever tried matching that same enthusiasm when it comes to your Christian walk? On the other hand, if you are one of those casual or "can't stand it" Christians, I would like to remind you of the victory that we have in Christ. Unlike the football field, where our team may win or lose, we are GUARANTEED victory when we follow Christ. Jesus tells us in John 16:33, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

In the end, we must also remember that our Christian journey is not a spectator sport. It is one in which we are actively involved. **Hebrews 12:1-2** says, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Let us make sure that we are running that race, as a die-hard fan for Christ.
