SELF CONTROL

When you think about it, a glove is a wonderful thing. Just think about what all a glove can do. It can turn a doorknob or roll down a car window. It can wave goodbye to a friend or applaud a great football play. It can pat someone on the back or even smack someone in the face. It can point. It can give a "thumbs up" sign. There is really no limit to what a glove can do. Right now, you are probably thinking that a glove cannot do all of that, it is the hand inside the glove that does all those things, and your right. A glove can only perform a task if there is a hand inside it. Otherwise, it is just going to lie there motionless. Why is that? Because the ability that the glove possesses comes from what fills the glove. And that is the same with you.

You may be trying to be more self-controlled in your life. You may want to try and control your anger, appetite, desires, or maybe your fears. But no matter how much you want self-control in those areas of your life, you cannot make it happen. Sure, you may be able to improve for a little while. But, in the end, no matter how hard you try, you will not develop true self-control on your own. Because self-control, like other virtues, comes from God.

The ability to truly have self-control in your life depends on whatever, or whoever, you fill your life with. Romans 8:5-8 says, "For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot. Those who are in the flesh cannot please God." In the end, those who are still under the control of their sinful nature can never please God.

Now why is that? Better yet, why can we not have self-control on our own? Because it is not a physical thing of this world. Think about this for a second, if you desire self-control in your life, what do you think of? The physical things that you want to control. In **Galatians** 5:22-23 says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." Self-control is a fruit of the Spirit, not flesh. Many Christians, especially new converts, will read about the fruit of the Spirit and try to polish up their lives so that

more of the fruit comes forth. They work and work in their own strength to develop those characteristics, but it never gets them very far. They might achieve a little more love, goodness, and patience, but there comes a point where they begin to fall short. Even worse, many then get to where they feel they cannot bear it anymore and give up.

The fruit of the Spirit is the fruit of God's work in our lives when we are obedient to the word of God, not the fruit of our own strength. Much like that glove, it is what we have inside us that gives us the ability. If we want to gain self-control, along with those other virtues, we must make sure that it is the Spirit that is within us and not our own fleshly desires. How do we do that? Psalm 119:11 tells us, "I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." The book of Psalms continues to drive this home as well. Psalm 37:31 says, "The law of his God is in his heart; his steps do not slip." We even see examples of self-control if we keep the word of God in our heart." Psalm 4:3-4 says, "But know that the Lord has set apart the godly for himself; the Lord hears when I call to him. Be angry, and do not sin; ponder in your own hearts on your beds, and be silent."

So if you are in Christ, the power to be self-controlled should already be with you. You don't have to grunt and groan or grit your teeth. Instead, you need to surrender all and give it God. Just as a glove surrenders to the hand that wears it, we must surrender to our Creator. **2 Corinthians 4:6-7** "For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shown in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us." If you want self-control, then selflessly give it to the One in control.

DAY OF PRAYER/GIVING FOR CHILDREN


