## STAND STRONG ON THE RIGHT FOUNDATION

It has certainly been sad to watch the news the past several days as we see the devastation left in the wake of Hurricane Helene, particularly when we see all the damage from the floods across the Appalachian Mountains. To see how quickly the rain and water could destroy entire communities is truly a humbling realization of the power of storms. As I have seen the news from all around, I also think of how fortunate some are as well. It seems that every year, as hurricane season comes, there are always videos of shorelines that are completely wiped out, except for one single house. There was a news reel I saw from Eastpoint, Florida that showed multiple houses being washed away, as one single house stood firm. What made that one house survive while all the others were destroyed? Well, a closer look at the picture showed that the house was built on a pile of large rocks, instead of on the sand.

Jesus says, in **Matthew 7:24-27**, "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

It is easy to see the lesson we can learn from Jesus' parable. Those houses represent our spiritual lives and each one of us are actively building our spiritual houses. The question we must ask ourselves is, are we purposely preparing or carelessly constructing? Notice that both men in the parable heard the message. They knew the information, but the difference was what they did with that information. One heeded the warning and prepared properly, while the other did not. It is very similar to what we see often when hurricanes hit beaches along the coast. You can quickly tell which houses were properly prepared for the storms and which ones were not prepared enough.

It is a fact of life that there will be storms, not only physical storms but storms like illness, loss of loved ones, financial struggles. There are things that can take our health and well-being, our peace of mind, our possessions. But how we respond to those tragedies reveal the quality of our spiritual building. Paul says in **Romans 8:35-39**, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Such an encouraging passage to remind us of the love of God but look a little closer at what Paul said. Notice that he said, "IN all these things we are more than conquerors". So often, we think that, by being a Christian, God is simply going to smooth out the road and we will have no more challenges, hardships, or setbacks. But that is not what God promises us. However, what He does promise is much better. He promises that even IN all these things, we can be more than conquerors.

That means when the storms come and destroy all our earthly possessions, we don't have to be devastated like someone who has no hope. Or when the doctor comes and tells me bad news, I don't have to fall apart like someone who has no hope. We can be more than a conquer in all circumstances because of Jesus and His love for us. We can stand strong. But, to stand strong, you need the right foundation. Ephesians 2:19-22 says, "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit." Make sure that your foundation is built on Christ and His word. Andrew Spivey
