THE DAY TO ANTICIPATE

The season is upon us. Prepare for the rest of 2024 to disappear in what seems like only a few weeks. With Thanksgiving and Christmas, the stores are constantly bustling, and children seem to have this constant smile with what is coming next. I have always loved fall and winter. As a child, I loved Halloween, not just because you get to dress up and get candy, but because I knew the next holiday was Thanksgiving. I also loved Thanksgiving, not simply because I got to eat all the turkey, dressing, and mashed potatoes I wanted, but because I knew the next holiday was Christmas. I still love all these holidays just as much as I always have, but for some reason I feel that the anticipation has slowly died down.

I remember how disappointing each day was when I found out that it wasn't the holiday yet. The days would seem to drag so slowly, and a month might as well have been a decade. I don't feel that way anymore. I feel as though I just took down the Christmas tree. I guess that is part of being a child though. The anticipation builds you up a little more each day until it is time.

When I think about this, I am amazed at how closely it relates to us being a child of God. As Christians, we are supposed to be preparing ourselves and looking for Jesus to return with anticipation. 2 Peter 3:11-12 says, "Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn!" However, we can grow weary of waiting. Just as I would continually ask my mother if "today was the day", we tend to do the same, and just as my parents would encourage me to be patient, God does the same to us. James 5:7-8 says, "Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand."

It is easy for us to become tired of waiting or even dull of hearing about it, but it is a day that we must always be anticipating. Even during the first century, there were some who were growing tired of waiting and even being mocked and scoffed at because of it. **2 Peter 3:4** says, "They will say, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things are continuing as they were from the beginning of creation."

Often, we are quick to come to that mindset. Just as we do with holidays as grown-ups, we begin to no longer anticipate the day as we once did. We become content with the world around us and forget the urgency that is needed when it comes to saving those who are lost. When Jesus said, "unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" in Matthew 18:3, I wonder if part of that was keeping the mindset of anticipation. After all, we know the reason that this earth is continuing. 2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." How can anyone come to repentance without us first showing them the importance of living for Christ. How could anyone come to Christ without us sharing with them the good news about His loving sacrifice.

Is today the day? We simply don't know, but it is a question we should be asking ourselves more and more. **Romans 13:11-12** says, "Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." We may not know what day Judgment will come, but we do know that we are a day closer than we were before. Are you ready? Are you waiting for it with anticipation or fear?
