During all the hustle and bustle of the holiday shopping season, if you are out in the crowds of all the shoppers, you might notice something quite ironic. With all the people cutting line with armloads of things and people fighting over the last big screen tv, if you look in a decoration section, you will probably see one. It is not the most exciting decoration maybe, and it can be written in different fonts, but chances are you will see a table or mantle decoration that simply spells JOY. Now what makes this decoration ironic? Well with our society bent on the pursuit of pleasure rather than truth, much of the world has become completely lost to what true joy actually is. Even as New Testament Christians, we must be alert and ready to distinguish between joy and sinful indulgence. After all, we would not be tempted to sin if there was no pleasure in it. And, just like those stacks of toys and Christmas gifts, the pleasures of sin come at a high cost. Romans 6:23 tells us that "the wages of sin is death," and that fleeting enjoyment that we gain from committing it will soon be over.

As followers of Christ, we must make it our duty to avoid making worldly pleasure our purpose in life and instead learning to find joy in serving the Lord. The question is, do our lives give evidence of the presence of joy in Christian service? Do people see us as happy and joyful people? If not, this would easily explain our lack of effectively reaching out to others. After all, the Gospel of Christ is GOOD News!!! Paul also says in **Philippians 4:4-5**, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand." We even read in **Galatians 5:22** that the fruit of the Spirit includes joy. If there is no joy in Christ, then where is the fruitful growth?

What many do not seem to realize is that joy is a byproduct of our own relationship with Christ, and we must spend more time in His presence in order to help it grow. **Psalm 16:11** says, "You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore." If the fullness of God's joy is not being reflected in your life, then what does that say about your presence? Paul also says in **Ephesians 1:3**, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ

with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places." The joy found as a Christian is a spiritual blessing, so one must be "in Christ" to experience true joy. If we simply stay on the outside, looking in, then true joy can never be attained.

Joy is the result of following God's plan. It is a characteristic of life that pushes past our own interests and personal comfort zones and seeks out the needs of others. Paul said in Philippians 2:2-4, "complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." We are also reminded, over and over, by both Jesus' teachings and examples that "it is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35) By following this plan set before us, we are able to see a true joy that we can only receive in Christ. And that joy begins to grow by the common unity of love we have for one another in Christ, which is secured by our hope of heaven, a place of eternal joy in the presence of our Heavenly Father. It is the hope of our names written in heaven in which we can truly rejoice, each and every day.

When I think of what it means to put aside the pursuit of worldly pleasures and seek out true joy that can only be found in God, I am reminded of Solomon. In Ecclesiastes, Solomon explains how he worked and struggled in every which way to find the whole meaning of life. So many of those paths ended in vain. Solomon finally concluded in Ecclesiastes 12:13, "The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man." This is the ultimate key to finding joy in life, realizing that our purpose in life is to seek God and please Him. (Acts 17:27) Do you want true joy in life? Seek God first. Through His guidance, you will learn to tell the difference between sinful, selfish indulgence and true pleasure. Then get to work serving God and following what He has said. The gift of joy isn't bought in a store. It was bought for us on the cross at Calvary.
