UNUSED GIFTS

One of the worst side effects of the commercialization of the Christmas season is the amount of unused gifts. I am under the impression that there are some companies that exist just to make gifts that are never used. Which makes sense, considering a total 5.4 billion dollars is spent on about 104 million unwanted gifts each year. According to a poll from the Daily Mail, we receive an average of eight Christmas presents each year and hate two of them. Men most dread receiving gaudy ties and ridiculous Christmas sweaters while women dislike diet books and tacky ornaments. Some even end up being great gifts, but simply go unused. People buy exercise equipment for Christmas to be used in the new year and by June it is in a yard sale. Other times, the gift may be well thought out and quite useful, but it gets lost in all the boxes and paper and ends up hidden on a shelf. Some are highly valued but mistreated by the recipient.

God has offered mankind some amazing gifts; some are appreciated, some are not. Some are embraced at first, and then discarded. Others are completely unused. In **James 1:17** we are reminded, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." Paul also goes on to say in **1 Corinthians 4:7**, "What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?" Everything that you have has been given to you by God. Unfortunately, there are many of these gifts that we leave un-utilized or underutilized. I would imagine at the top of the list of unused gifts from God would be our own brains.

Each one of you who are reading these very words were blessed by God to receive a brain. It has been estimated that the human brain can store over 2.5 million gigabytes, and the average brain thinks anywhere from 50,000 to 80,000 thoughts each day. Although these are great numbers and statistics, are we utilizing it properly? Much like a college athlete who had every shot at the pro's but blew it over drugs, cheating, or simply quitting, many have such a powerful gift from God in their head yet never actually use it as it was intended. So, what is our brain designed for anyway?

First off, God designed our brain to consider things. Unfortunately, many do not spend time considering how much they are truly wasting. When God commands Israel to rebuild the Temple, He addresses this exact problem. **Haggai 1:5-6** says, "Now, therefore, thus says the Lord of

hosts: Consider your ways. You have sown much, and harvested little. You eat, but you never have enough; you drink, but you never have your fill. You clothe vourselves, but no one is warm. And he who earns wages does so to put them into a bag with holes." Not only are we supposed to consider our actions and steps with our brain, but we are to seek knowledge and be willing to study to find it (Proverbs 15:14,28). But once we are able to study and find the knowledge of truth, we are to test, examine, and meditate on that truth to make sure that we are obedient to it and that we are in it. 2 Corinthians 13:5 says, "Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? — unless indeed you fail to meet the test!" We see what the brain should be meditating on as well in Philippians 4:8 which says, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

Unfortunately, this isn't how many want to use their brain today. They would rather use their brain to get ahead of the competition and put others down or to make money fast and spend it even faster on reckless living that does nothing but shorten an already short life. Others don't use their brain at all and simply go with the flow of what someone else in society tells them. But that is not why God gifted us with a brain. Romans 12:2 says, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." He did not design our brain to follow blindly, but to search out the truth in all matters and that truth is found in His son. Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." and Jesus is the truth that should captivate the completeness of our mind (2 Corinthians 10:5). So, during this holiday season, when you open that present that you already know you're not going to use, take a moment and make sure that you are using what God has gifted you with. **Andrew Spivey**
