LIVE FOR HIM

In 2 Kings 5 we learn of a commander in the Syrian army by the name of Naaman. We learn that through God, Syria had been blessed with several victories because of Naaman as well. However, Naaman had a problem as well. Although he was a mighty man of valor, he was also a leper. (2 Kings 5:1) One day, an Israelite servant said to Naaman's wife that she wished that he would go to see the prophet and be healed. Naaman took this news to the king who sent Naaman on his way with the equivalent of 750 pounds of silver, 150 pounds of clothing, and 10 changes of clothes along with a letter of recommendation. (2 Kings 5:2-6)

Naaman goes to the king of Israel with all his gifts and his letter, seeking a cure. The king is distressed for a moment thinking that this was the king of Syria's way of picking a fight by sending a man with leprosy to him, but when Elisha hears about it he has the king send Naaman to his house. (2 Kings 5:7-8) And here is where it gets interesting. I can imagine what Naaman is feeling at this moment. I imagine that Naaman has already tried just about everything to remove this disease from himself. He is desperate to be cured, and now being told by the king of Israel to go visit Elisha. He goes there with all his horses and chariots and...Elisha doesn't come out. He doesn't invite Naaman in or anything. Instead, he sends out a messenger to Naaman and simply says, "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored, and you shall be clean."

(2 Kings 5:10)

What would you feel in that moment? You've just heard that there is the possibility of being saved from a terminal and painful illness. Wouldn't you be a little bit excited? Wouldn't you be hopeful? Wouldn't you run off immediately to wash in the river? Well, Naaman wasn't. He got angry and began to walk away. He obviously wanted to be cured, but he also wanted things to be done the way he expected them to be done. **2 Kings 5:11-12** says, "But Naaman was angry and went away, saying, "Behold, I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call upon the name of the Lord his God, and wave his hand over the place and cure the leper. Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them and be clean?" So, he turned and went away in a rage." It is as if he has heard this from other people before. He has had people tell him "All you need to do is wash and it will go away." He even knows of some better places with some cleaner water than that of the Jordan. So, he begins to leave angrily. I mean, Elisha wouldn't even come out to see him! He wouldn't even come out and wave his hand over him and make the leprosy vanish.

At this point is where Naaman's servant says something quite profound. In **2 Kings 5:13**, "his servants came near and spoke to him, and said, "My father, *if* the prophet had told you *to do* something great, would you not have done *it*? How much more then, when he says to you, 'Wash, and be clean'?"...If the prophet had told you to do some great thing, would you not have done it?

What if God had asked us to do "some great thing" to receive his love and forgiveness, would we do it? What if God said that to get to heaven we each had to be able to lift 600 lbs. Do you think we could start a gym and a weightlifting plan? If God said that to be forgiven we would have to swim across the English Channel, wouldn't we start practicing our backstroke? But God doesn't ask some incredible feat from us. What He wants is something that anyone, anywhere, at any time can do. No physical ability required. No minimum cash payment. No prerequisite IO. God wants us to love Him and submit to His will. We may want to have things our way so that we can still have control over our lives. But what we need to be cured of cannot be fixed by our own efforts. Christ has already done 'some great thing' for us. We need only to be washed in the water and live for Him. (John 3:5)
