GIFTS

Christmas has come and gone for 2024 and as we round the corner for New Year's, I hope you have had a great Christmas and enjoyed all its festivities. I am always a little sad to see the Christmas season pass. It always seems as though people are a little bit happier this time of the year. I think one of the biggest reasons for that is because of the opportunity to give gifts to people we care about. There aren't many times throughout the year that we have the chance to give gifts to those we love. There is no greater feeling than to see the face of someone light up as they open a present that you picked out for them. The very act of giving gifts truly shows our generosity and love for one another, and that love brings forth happiness in ourselves as well as the receiver. But why is it that we only seem to give out gifts during this time of the year?

As Christians, we need to be actively looking for ways to be giving gifts to others all year long. Not only physical gifts, but the gifts that God has blessed us with as well. Hebrews 13:16 says, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." It is so easy for us to get wrapped up in the seasons and simply go with the traditions, but we must make sure that we take the time to be cheerful givers throughout the year as well. There is a great example of this kind of heart found in Acts 9:36-43. It is here where we read of a woman named Tabitha, but she is better known as Dorcas. We don't know much about her, but what we learn from these few passages tell us a lot about her character.

Dorcas was a disciple of Christ who had become sick and passed away. Some of the other disciples of Christ heard that Peter was nearby and sent for him to come to the house where they had laid her. When Peter arrives, he finds widows weeping and mourning the loss of their dear friend. **Acts 9:40-42** tells us, "But Peter put them all outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. And he gave her his hand and raised her up. Then, calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord."

Of course, I would imagine anyone who had died and was brought back to life would cause quite a stir, but what was it about Dorcas that caused her resurrection from the dead to cause many to come to Christ? Well, it was because of her love for others and what she did for those around her. **Acts 9:36** tells us "She was full of good works and acts of charity." and in

verse **39**, when all the widows were weeping around her, we read that they showed Peter the "tunics and other garments that Dorcas made while she was with them." It was because she had a giving heart and reflected Christ in her life that made such an impact to those around her and caused others to come to Christ.

As we strive to be the New Testament church that Christ died for, we often spend a lot of time making sure that our worship properly reflects the pattern laid out for us by Jesus and the Apostles, and rightfully so. However, we shouldn't forget to reflect the pattern laid out for us of their hearts as well. 1 John 3:16-19 says, "By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him:"

With this in mind, and with the new year coming shortly, I would like to encourage you to make a "new year's resolution", and that resolution would be for each one of us to develop a new habit for ourselves, or continue to build on a habit that we have already been working on. Let us seek out and make opportunities to reflect the love of Christ to one another and to those who are in our lives that are lost in sin. Whether it be a loved one, a friend or neighbor, or a stranger. Let us strive to seek out how we can be a blessing for them. Because if we can reflect the heart of Christ and His disciples more each day, imagine how many others would believe in the Lord. The best thing is that we know this kind of effort is effective in bringing souls to Christ. Not only do we have the example of Dorcas, but Jesus tells us in Matthew 5:16 to "let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."
