SUIT UP

Imagine two knights sitting on horses, overlooking a castle they are about to attempt capturing. The castle is heavily fortified with large walls, moats, and gates. Even more, there are soldiers and archers waiting to attack the pair. The first knight wears a shining suit of armor. He has a heavy helmet to protect his head and a massive iron suit from head to toe. He even has gloves and boots made of metal to protect even his fingers. The second knight wears a simple linen shirt, a wool cap, and some comfortable shoes. The first knight looks to the second and says, "We will attack the castle on my signal, and we will soon have victory!" He then raises his broadsword over his head and charges towards the castle. The second knight simply picks up a small stick he found in the woods and follows behind.

Which knight would you want to be? The first knight is rather confined. It is probably a little hot and stuffy inside the armor. His vision is a little limited with only a small slit to look out of and the faceplate makes it difficult to wipe the sweat off his face . The suit is also hard and limiting to move around in, and if there is an itch on his back good luck scratching that. The second knight has no restrictions at all. His shirt is loose and breezy. His cap is not heavy or cumbersome and he has perfect vision. His pants aren't binding and keep him from being able to run, and his shoes are soft and flexible enough to wiggle his toes if he wants to. The second knight is totally free of any restrictions. He must have it made right? Wrong.

Although the first knight may feel restricted by his armor, he is wearing it for his own good. When archers begin raining arrows at him, they simply bounce off or even break upon hitting him. When someone comes at him with a sword, their strikes and blows glance off him and he is not harmed. The second knight may be more comfortable and more "free" but in reality, he is unprotected.

Paul explains in Ephesians 6, that God's commands work like a suit of armor. He says in **Ephesians 6:11**, "Put on the whole armor of God,

that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil." God's spiritual armor is designed to protect you from the fiery darts from Satan (Ephesians 6:16), and keep you ready to fight off any spiritual adversary. For example, God's command not to steal protects you from all guilt and fear of punishment from getting caught. It also protects you from shame, or embarrassment from being caught. His command to not lie protects us from being trapped in a chain or web of lies, in which we must keep creating new lies just to cover up old ones. It also ensures continued trust between friends and family. God's command to forgive others who have wronged you keeps you from becoming bitter or resentful. It also protects you from seeking revenge and getting in trouble.

I am sure leading up to the castle, the first knight was thinking of how much nicer it would be to not have to wear all that armor, but in the middle of the fight, those thoughts quickly leave his mind. We must remember that we are in a spiritual battle as well. Paul says in Ephesians 6:12, "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." We are also warned in **1 Peter 5:8**, "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." We do not know when our adversary will attack so, we must continue to take up the whole armor of God: truth, righteousness, the gospel of peace, faith, salvation, and the word of God.
